TIME TO WRITE WRITERS' RETREAT

Join us for a weekend devoted to writing in a beautiful setting. Writing can be lonely work, so spending a few days with fellow writers can give you the boost you've been looking for. Most of all, this retreat is your chance to get away from the demands of daily life and focus on your writing. You will have the opportunity to write in a quiet common area or be off on your own. And there's more!

Using guidelines that inspire constructive and positive suggestions, award-winning writer Barbara Morrison will lead critique sessions for those who want feedback on their work. In these sessions, we will also discuss relevant craft topics. You may choose to rest and recharge, or you may prefer to walk the lovely paths at camp and nearby Nature Conservancy trails. Evenings may include readings and games in front of the fire.

Your fee includes housing and meals. Nine spectacular meals are provided, from Thursday dinner through Sunday lunch. Campers who have attended previous retreats rave about the quality of the food.

PINEWOODS CAMP, INC.

A beautiful rustic camp, nestled in pine and beech forest, Pinewoods is located in a 25-acre pine and beech forest between Long Pond and Round Pond in Plymouth, Massachusetts. The ponds may still be warm enough for swimming, and the sandy paths are perfect for inspirational walks. Note that no lifeguard will be provided.

We will be using a large house and several small cabins, all providing comfortable overnight accommodation for campers. Most are furnished with two beds, wooden chairs, tables, small closets, chests of drawers, lamps, mirrors. The house has both comfortable furniture and large tables where we can gather. Modern bathrooms and showers are located in the house and in separate buildings nearby.

Barbara Morrison, who writes under the name B. Morrison, is a poet and writer, a publisher, teacher, and dancer. In her recent poetry collection, *Terrarium*, she explores the influence of place: where you live, where you travel, where you go in dreams. Her previous collection, *Here at Least*, chronicles a journey undertaken in response to Rilke's directive: "You must change your life." She is also the author of an award-winning memoir, *Innocent: Confessions of a Welfare Mother*, a powerful coming-of-age story that dispels some of the myths and misunderstandings about those living in poverty. It is now available as an audiobook.

Her writing has appeared in anthologies and literary journals such as *Little Patuxent Review*, *The Sun Magazine*, *Tiny Lights*, and elsewhere.
